The Partnership

- Aligned purpose to create an inclusive world where all children can thrive.
- Collaborating together since 2017 to expand measures within the OurSCHOOL Survey
- A common aim to make school inclusive and accessible for all students.



15% of students identified as having a disability

Students with disabilities:

- are 21% less likely to feel a positive sense of belonging in their school.
- are 3x more likely to experience physical bullying in school compared to students without a disability. (24% vs. 8%)
- experience 17% lower rate of positive relationships with their peers at school.
- Almost 1 in 3 students felt excluded from school activities and learning opportunities by other students.

Capture the voice of your students

OurSCHOOL Secondary Student Survey (Grade 7-12)

What: A survey to measure well-being, bullying and exclusion, engagement, classroom environment and other factors known to affect learning

outcomes.

Why: To support student learning and help guide school-level improvement

planning

How: By measuring and reporting on important factors in a timely basis


